On motion of Mr. Cardiff, seconded by Mr. Hodgson, it was ordered,—That the name of Mr. McDonald (Hamilton South) be substituted for that of Mr. Jorgenson on the Standing Committee on Miscellaneous Private Bills.

Mr. Comtois, seconded by Mr. Monteith (Perth), moved,—That the House do go into Committee of the Whole at its next sitting to consider the following proposed resolution which has been recommended to the House by His Excellency:
