

And the motion, in amendment, by the Honourable Senator McGeer—

That the said motion be amended by striking out all the words after "That" in the first line thereof, and substituting therefor the following:—

"any Standing or Special Committee of the Senate be authorized to examine any resolution or proposed Bill laid before Parliament in advance of the resolution or Bill reaching the Senate.

It was Ordered, That the said Order of the Day be postponed until the next sitting of the Senate.

The Senate adjourned during pleasure.

The Senate resumed.

A Message was brought from the House of Commons by their Clerk with a Bill (14), intituled: "An Act for carrying into effect the Agreement for a Food and Agriculture Organization of the United Nations between Canada and certain other Nations and Authorities," to which they desire the concurrence of the Senate.

The said Bill was read the first time.

With leave of the Senate,

The said Bill was then read the second and third times.

The question was put whether this Bill shall pass.

It was resolved in the affirmative.

Ordered, That a Message be sent to the House of Commons to acquaint that House that the Senate have passed this Bill, without any amendment.

With leave of the Senate, and—

On motion of the Honourable Senator Robertson, it was—

Ordered, That when the Senate adjourns to-day, it do stand adjourned until Tuesday, the twenty-third day of October, at eight o'clock in the evening.

The Senate adjourned during pleasure.
