- Preliminary master plans for candidate sites in unrepresented southern regions will be revised.
 - Consultations with communities near proposed parks north of the 50th parallel will be initiated.
- Public hearings will be held on the Saguenay Marine Park Management Plan.

NEW BRUNSWICK GOVERNMENT PROGRESS

1) New Sites

 No new protected areas were added to the provincial protected areas system in 1991-92.

2) Systems Planning Progress

- New Brunswick endorsed the Endangered Spaces program.
- The Round Table on Environment and Economy recommended the establishment of a system of protected areas representing the important natural features of all the province's biogeographic regions by 1995.
- The Provincial Parks and Heritage Sites Master Plan (1990) has recommended re-direction of the parks system towards natural region representation.
 - A provisional first draft of a natural regions map is under review which defines 10 terrestrial and 4 marine eco-regions.
- Preparation of a database that provides a physical description of these natural regions is underway for completion by March 1993.
- The current Provincial Parks system is being assessed to determine the level of representation of the proposed natural regions (to be concluded March 1994).

3) Action Planned for 1992-93

- 5 new Ecological Reserves will be established during the 1992 fiscal year.
- The final draft of the New Brunswick natural regions map will be adopted.
