for unanticipated offences not yet committed. That is what this legislation in effect does.

The Minister of Justice (Mr. Garson) said it is not a crime to entertain wrongful ideas so long as they are not overt acts. With that principle, Mr. Speaker, I agree.

However, if parliament grants this power as asked for by this back-door method it will in fact be making it a crime, within the designated limits of regulations about which we know nothing, to create an offence for alleged wrongful ideas.

What is the offence to be? Guilt by That is something which, I think, should be debated in this house—the concept too often regarded in neighbouring countries as a reason for destroying the reputation, if not the livelihood, of those who have committed no offence other than being suspected of wrongful thought. When I think of those who say there should be guilt by association I often wonder what the position of members of this House of Commons would be who sat in this house for three or four long years with a member who was a communist and who was afterwards convicted as a traitor to this country.

This type of legislation granting to the governor in council the power to do that which the council of the governor is afraid to bring before this house in direct legislation is a negation of parliament, and as far as I am concerned I am going to vote against it.
