It is taken into Confideration, Whether it would be neceffary for the Service his Majefty's Sloop Furnace is ordered upon to make the following Alterations, which were mentioned by a Letter from Capt. Middleton to Sir Jacob Ackworth, and for want of time could not be effected, viz, the Quarter-Deck to be made flush with the present main Deck, by having a flight one laid over the former, and a Companion Way thereupon made to go down into the Steerage; the former Paffage thereto being not only inconvenient, but very dangerous for Perfons coming from below to go forwards, when the Capfton is in use, as Capt. Middleton by fad Experience found, being jamm'd between the End of a Capfton Bar and the Companion.

And it was Refolved, That confidering the high and traverse Seas in this Part of the World, and the Probability of thipping large Quantities of Water, it is absolutely necessary to have the Quarter-Deck made flush with the Main-Deck, the Sloop to be fteer'd with a Wheel, dead Lights hung with Hinges to be fixed to the great Cabbin Windows, which will make more room for the Capfton than is at prefent, and which we shall be obliged to use very frequently upon our entering or coming out of Harbours, warping among Ice, and upon Account of
