

An interesting portion of the Exhibition was the process of type-founding, printing, and bookbinding, which was shown in operation.

Loverin's Historical Centograph was also on exhibition, with the Historical Chart of Time on the Zaba method.

While the Exhibition was in progress, several very valuable additions were made to the collection, two of which at least it may be interesting to record—first, a book by Faust, only four years later than the great Mazarin Bible.
