The Collegiate year begins on the last Thursday in August, and ends on the first Wednesday in May.

This period is divided into two terms, between which there is a recess at Christmas of one week.

Convocation is held on the last day of the Collegiate year, and is followed by the Summer Vacation.

Candidates for admission may be examined either on the day after Convocation, or on the day before the opening in August.
