**UNCANNY STORIES.**

By F. M. Crawford.

Ghost stories continue to fascinate despite the increase of the scientific spirit. Marlon Crawford's posthumous volume contains seven stories of weirdness and horror. The first is entitled "The Dead Smile." In it an unbelievably wicked old scoundrel is represented as taking to his grave wilfully the secret of the actual relationship of two young persons who happen to be his own children. His object is to revenge his mothers by having them marry each other. There is an air of mystery in the plot, and a banish in the likeness of one of the mothers, and a family tomb and an ancestor (beheaded on the Hill) who, will not stay in his coffin. Hardly less grisly is the tale of "The Screaming Skull." This tells how a certain doctor slew his wife and kept her polished skull in a box, till one day it leaped at his throat and bit him to death. The thing sounds very bald, thus stated, but in this case Mr. Crawford has done the telling with singular effectiveness.

"Man Overboard" is another variation on the old theme of the two brothers who, in the same rig, worked out so as to involve the lives of one of them over the side, a haunted ship, and a thing in gleaming oilskins coming up out of the sea to spool the wailing, yet another, "For the Blood is the Life," is laid in Mr. Crawford's favorite Italy, near an old tower, built to guard against Barbary pirates. It is a tale of stolen treasure and a wrath-woman with vampirish tastes, whose body, lying buried with the treasure, seems always—when the moon shines—on the top of the mound which marks the spot. One can see it so from the platform on top of the old tower.

A less successful experiment than either of these two is the tale entitled "The Upper Berth." It concerns the tribulations of a passenger who found that a slimy dead thing from out of the sea persisted in climbing aboard every night thru his cabin porthole and occupying the upper berth. The same ghostly visitor had already frightened three other passengers into suicide by leaping over the rail, and the traveler in question "escaped" that damp fate, he did get his arm broken in a tussle with the thing which, incidentally, knocked the breath out of the captain. That happened while the officer was sharing the passenger's watch with a view to solving the mystery.

Altogether, for those who like ghost stories and like them strong, this volume of Mr. Crawford's may be recommended as likely to provide the desired effects and sensations in a quite satisfactory fashion. (Macmillan Co., Toronto.)
