AMATEUR GOLF CHAMPIONSHIPS

Inter-Provincial Match Today
Opens Big Week on the
—Lambton Links.

The golfers' Victoria Cross—the amateur championship of Canada—is down for settlement during the present week on the Lambton golf links. The old reliable, George S. Lyon, the present champion, has entered and it would not be surprising if his many friends of this year added another championship to his list. Many golfers, especially of the eighteen handicap variety, think that Mr. Lyon is too old to stand the strain of a championship. If some of these doubts would only take the trouble to study golf history they would know that John Graham was almost as old a man as Mr. Lyon when he won the English amateur championship—one of the most strenuous and keenly contested competitions in the world. Good wins come out of old bottles and good golf is only obtainable from lengthy experience and practice. Mr. Lyon has both the latter qualifications and will undoubtedly make an excellent showing in the present championship.

G. H. Turpin of the Royal Montreal Golf Club and the amateur champion in 1913, is a force to be reckoned with. He is a steady, even player, and not by any means a gallery player. He is, however, every time and seldom if ever makes a mistake. Charlie Murray, the professional of the Royal Montreal, says Mr. Turpin is just now playing at the top of his game and looks upon him as Canada's best choice.

The course at Lambton is said to be in excellent condition and the greens, after the recent rain and the sunshine of yesterday, should be keen and there should be little room for any excuse for bad putting, but there, it is never the players' fault that they miss a putt, it's always that beastly green.

This morning an inter-provincial match is down discussion. If the teams are anything like representative some indications may be given as to the men likely to figure in the semi-final for the championship on Friday next.

The ladies' doubles honors were won by Miss Best and Miss McDonald of the Toronto Club, who defeated Mrs. Bickle and Mrs. Henderson of the same club. This was a closely-contested match, the score showing 6-3, 6-4.

Stephenson won in the men's handicap, Class B, defeating Sedgwick by 6-3, 6-5. J. V. McKenzie was edged out by Stephenson in the semi-final.

There was a good-sized crowd out to see the tennis battles on Saturday, and Monday's games should attract another big gallery, for the features include not only the Baird-Rennie final, but also the final in the ladies' handicap, and in the men's doubles and the mixed doubles.

The match between Baird and Meen was the feature of Saturday's play. The Broadway man gave the former city champion a tough contest. The first set was tied three times, and the match was marked by some of the best tennis seen in the city.
