of the smaller business, compete against the larger? Could the farmer get the same price as he gets now for a bushel of wheat? The speaker did not think so.

It was quite evident from remarks made by Mr. Frankland that he had not studied the question. It was the business of the electors of East York to study it for him. The only thing to do was to keep our own markets for our own products.

Mr. Maclean cited the allied labor law as an example of how friendly disposed to Canadians the National Policy would be. He would advocate a similar law here, which would demand an eye for an eye and a tooth for a tooth.

Mr. E. F. Cross, the next speaker, dwelt on the inconsistencies of the Liberal policies. He denounced Mr. Laurier and his party, referring to a voice-which Mr. Maclean voted for a resolution introduced by Laurier. Mr. Cross said that he was not for any resolution by any leader, providing that it was clearly in the country's benefit.

Mr. E. F. Cross made a lengthy speech, full of figures and facts which there was no disputing. He showed how the National Policy protected industry in all lines and helped the manufacturer to live. He showed the other side of the coin, that if the National Policy were to be abandoned, the manufacturer would be ruined.
