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CITY NEWS.

Returned in Good Health. Senator George A. Cox and Mrs. Cox returned to Toronto yesterday, after a few months' vacation in the Old Country. To a World reporter, Mr. Cox politely but firmly declined to say anything for publication. His visit, he said, had been undertaken for pleasure, and he had enjoyed himself, and returned in first-class health, which he attributed to the good air of the Old Country.

Will Decrease Lumber Cut. The Ontario Lumbermen's Association at a special meeting which was held at the Board of Trade practically decided to form an alliance with some insurance companies to help with other manufacturers in an insurance scheme, to circumvent the ordinary insurance companies, who have raised the rates on lumber to a level ranging from 50 to 225 per cent. Owing to the high prices of supplies and labor, a resolution was adopted to decrease the cut next season.

Ex-Finance Minister Will Manage. A reorganization of the Provincial Trust Co. of Ontario has taken place, and the future of the bank will be known as the Union Trust Co. The capital is \$2,000,000, of which \$500,000 is paid up. Mr. J. H. McMillan, ex-finance minister, will continue to act as general manager, as well as vice-president, and other directors are: Hon. George E. Foster, president; Hon. E. G. Stevenson, Detroit, second vice-president; Judge Bishop, ex-justice; Hon. J. D. Wilson, K.C., Chatham, directors. The new company has purchased from the old trust all their stock and assets, and has become a new organization, and not an amalgamation.

Fast Service From Montreal. Canadian passenger liners making good time from Montreal to New York, via the St. Lawrence. The Lake Megantic of the Elder-Dempster Company leaves New York, just from Liverpool, on the morning trip, 7 days 4 hours. This is a very quick run. A cablegram has been received by the company from Montreal, that the ship, the Lake Simcoe, on her last run yesterday, made 17 1/2 knots per hour on a measured course. This vessel made the same trip from Montreal on the 4th pro.

Fell Between Two Joints. Thomas Rolston, employed at the Eaton Co.'s stable, corner of Yonge and James streets, between two joints yesterday, a distance of 12 feet, and sustained a painful injury to his back. He was helping another man to move a large box, and the box slipped, and the man fell on his back. The ambulance took him to his home at 38 Gladstone avenue.

Clerks All Busy. Mrs. Elizabeth Doherty was honorably acquitted yesterday of a charge of stealing a 98-cent umbrella from Eaton on Aug. 2 last. Mrs. Doherty explained to the court that she was taking it to a clerk farther down the counter, as all the clerks in her immediate vicinity were engaged when Mr. Book and her arrested on a charge of theft. The judge referred to the case as an unfortunate mistake.

Shoe Operator Arrested. Detective Davis yesterday morning arrested Edward Higgins of 44 Bonlieu avenue, on the complaint of the J. D. King Co., Limited, by whom she was employed as a clerk. It is alleged that Miss Higgins altered the amount of her pay slips and secured money by false pretenses. The specific charge is one of stealing \$4 yesterday. The alleged thefts have been carried on for some time.
