## DEPORTATION ORDERED BY IMMIGRATION AGENT

American Who Faced Serious Charge  
Will Go Back to U. S. Navy.

A charge of violating the Dominion immigration law was laid by Inspector William Anderson on a Canadian in Boston in police court today. The man was given for Anderson's deportation to the United States, where he will be handed over to the naval authorities who will proceed against him on a charge of desertion from the Canadian navy. Anderson and his wife Dorothy were first arraigned in police court two days ago on charges of vagrancy and disorderly conduct.

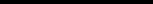
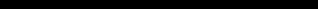
Mrs. Anderson appealed to the police court, claiming her husband had no money. The police intended laying a charge of procuring against Anderson on information furnished by a confidential source, but this was withdrawn. Mrs. Anderson was released on bail to appear at the Salvation Army's chief home.
