North Oxford M. P. P. Criti- Pair From London Hospital Were Going To Toronto.

Galt Driver's Auto Hit by C. Large Percentage of Spuds Unfit For Eating Despite High Prices.

WOODSTOCK, Dec. 5.—Citizens who laid in what they thought was going to be a winter's supply of potatoes, are somewhat disappointed, owing to the prevalance of dry rot, which makes the spuds unfit for food. The crop in this vicinity was a large one, but the growers are much disappointed at the percentage of bad potatoes. Considerable dissatisfaction has been shown with the quality of potatoes offered by some farmers on the market, and also by local importers. The price quoted is from \$2.25 to \$2.50 per bag, and the consumer naturally expects to get edible potatoes. Only last week a carload of potatoes brought in by a local buyer were found to be unfit for consumption. Some of the potatoes were resold and the purchasers found on cutting into them that they were infected with dry rot. The health inspector was notified and condemned the whole lot and the vendor was ordered to destroy them.
