CONSERVATIVES HOLD CONTROL IN HAMILTON

Ald. Dickson Declared Ald. Farrer Had Broken Pledge as Independent-General City News.

HAMILTON, Jan. 13.—(Special.)—The city council held its first regular meeting this evening. The Conservatives captured everything in sight, including every chairmanship and the appointments. They were recognized this because Ald. Farrer joined with them. Ald. Dickson pitched into Ald. Farrer, claiming that Ald. Farrer had been elected as an independent, and had broken his pledge to the electors to see that everybody got a fair deal. He compared Ald. Farrer to an American and told Ald. Dickson to speak in a similar strain. Ald. Sweeney and Clarke and A. J. Wright defended Ald. Farrer. Ald. Wright remarked that Ald. Dickson had played traitor to his own party last year to get the chairmanship of the finance committee.

The following appointments were made: Board of education, John E. Woodell and R. McCullough; court of revision, Richard Mackay and Col. A. H. Moore; library board, Alex. Hayes; board of health, James Dowling and Frank Quinn. A special committee was appointed to confer with Col. J. M. Gibson on the radical bill, which will come up in the house this week. Ald. Dickson wrote stating that he would eliminate all references to the streets of Hamilton in the bill if the city would not oppose the bill. The hydro-electric by-law providing for the installation of a municipal street lighting plant and the purchase of new pumps for the waterworks were given their third readings.

POLICE CHIEF ARRESTED FOR WHOLESALE THEFTS

Provincial Detective Miller Does Clever Work in Manitoulin Island.

LITTLE CURRENT, Manitoulin, Jan. 12.—The arrest of Chief of Police McEachern on a charge of theft has caused a big sensation here. On Dec. 1 there was a big fire, several buildings being destroyed. Many articles were stolen from the burned buildings. The local police force was apparently unable to get a line on the thieves, and the attorney-general's department detailed Provincial Detective Miller to investigate. Acting as an insurance agent, the detective visited the chief's house, and wound up by arresting the police chief on a charge of theft, and also apprehended Alex. McEachern, the chief's brother. Two appeared before the police magistrate and were committed for trial. The magistrate ordered that the articles were stolen from the burned buildings be returned to their owners. The magistrate also ordered that the chief's house be searched, but could find no stolen property until he got an ax, with which he chopped up the kitchen floor, and not for more than or injudicious attempts. MEDALS FOR MINERS. Imperial Decoration for Cases of Heroism in Quarries.

A Gazette announcement will be made by the Ontario Government, by request of the under-secretary of state, Ottawa, concerning the Edward Medal for saving or attempting to save life in mines or quarries within his majesty's dominions. The medals of two classes, to be bestowed on persons of either sex or of any nationality. Awards will only be made in cases of a high and exceptional order, and not for mere rash or injudicious attempts. The first class is a circular silver medal, bearing the effigy of his majesty. The reverse bears a design of the rescue of a miner with the inscription, "For Courage." The second-class medal is similar, but of bronze.

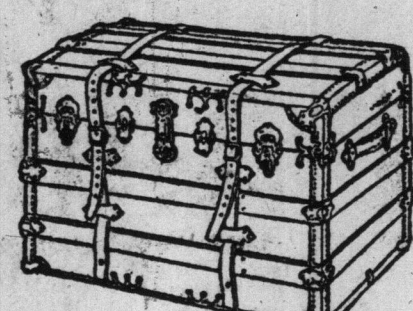

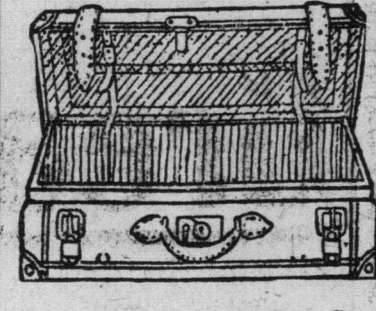

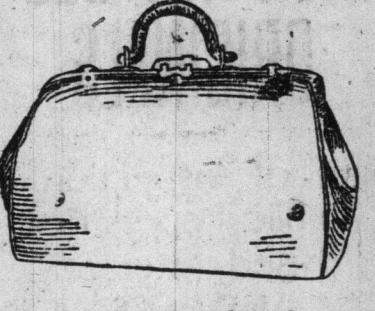
