that in the present year one-fourth of the whole number of ear diseases was composed of chronic discharges from the drum cavity. In children the great majority of cases of this class occur in connection with whooping cough, measles and scarlet fever. The importance and gravity of any ear symptons in connection with either of the foregoing diseases should be understood, that early and appropriate treatment may be employed to save the hearing, and prevent much suffering as well as the inconvenience of suppurative and often disagreeable discharges, that are almost sure to follow if this form of an ear disease is allowed to go uncase, or that these observations only apply to Dispensary practice, for my experience has been the same among private
