BRITISH GOVERNMENT TO TAKE AWAY 30,000 BARS License Reduction on an Enormous Scale is Provided for in the Government's New Bill in Great Britain.

LONDON, Mar. 3.—Rt. Hon. Mr. Asquith, chancellor of the exchequer, has introduced in the house of commons the government's long-looked-for licensing bill. Its sweeping provisions will, if enacted, reduce the number of licensed houses in England and Wales by one-third, doing away with about 30,000 bars at which intoxicants are now sold.

SUFFRAGETTES' BILL PASSES FIRST READING Minimal Point Scored by London Women Who Want to Vote—They Cheer.
