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Canada. He especially dwelt on the absolute necessity of the most scrupulous cleanliness in every part of the cheese-making process, from the milking of the cow to the arrangement of the curing room. At the conclusion of his remarks, he drew attention to the subject of Sunday cheese-making, regretting that the practice very largely prevailed among American dairymen, and urging several weighty considerations against such a practice coming into existence in this country.

After the delivery of these addresses, the Convention proceeded to consider the report on organization and general business, and having pretty thoroughly discussed the various recommendations embodied therein, unanimously adopted the following preamble and resolutions, thereby organizing "The Canadian Dairymen's

ASSOCIATION."

Whereas it is deemed expedient to form a Canadian Dairymen's Association, through which, as a medium, results of the practical experience of dairymen may be gathered and disseminated among

the dairying community, therefore be it Resolved, that we, the undersigned, do hereby associate ourselves together for mutual improvement in the science of cheese-making, and more efficient action in promoting the general interests of the dairy community.

Article 1. The name of the organization shall be "The Canadian

Dairymen's Association."

Article 2. The officers of the Association shall consist of a Presi-

dent, twenty Vice-Presidents, a Secretary and Treasurer.

Article 3. The President, Vice-Presidents, Secretary and Treasurer, shall constitute the Executive Board of the Association, seven of whom shall form a quorum for the transaction of business.

Article 4. The officers of the Association shall be elected at each regular annual meeting, and shall retain their offices until

their successors are chosen.

Article 5. The regular annual meeting shall be held on the first Wednesday in February of each year, and at such place as the Executive Board shall designate.

Article 6. Any person may become a member of the Association, and be entitled to all its benefits, by the annual payment of one dollar.
