7.—REPORT OF MEMORIAL COMMITTEE.

Your Committee have carefully considered the statements set forth in the memorials from Grace, Bannatyne and Zion Churches, would report as follows:—

(1.)—That in our opinion the separate existence of the congregation now worshiping in Bannatyne Street Church is a denominational necessity.

(2.)—That we recommend the removal of the building now occupied by that congregation to a place sufficiently distant from Grace and Zion Churches so as not to materially affect their congregations, or to a point not less than three-quarters of a mile from Grace Church, and not less than seven-eighths of a mile from Zion Church.

(3.)—That we further recommend their case to the favorable consideration of the Central Board of Missions for a grant for the present year.

8.—REPORT OF SABBATH SCHOOL COMMITTEE.

Your Committee in presenting this, their first report, feel that owing to the newness of the work and the far scattered fields of labor upon which our Ministers are frequently placed, that it is difficult to obtain ample returns from all our stations. We have, however, in these lands more than sixty-eight schools, in which are
