One or two days when the yachts drove through the brine, lee rails under water, with the spume driven from the bows flying madly high, sails as flat as a board, sheets—good hempen ones—strained to their utmost, masts—of good solid Oregon pine—bending to the strain, but everything holding and driving a splendid, wholesome creation at racehorse speed for the goal. It is that great American pastime to give way to fair-weather sailing, where white dunnets reign and clikers are unknown? It is to be hoped not. It is time for another deed of gift—it has been changed many times—with a stipulation that racing-machines are barred, and calling for sound, wholesome boats, which shall be worth something afterwards, and which shall be models for other ships as have been copy today's cup racers for anything whatever. They are not yachts, they are racing machines, pure and simple, and should be so classed. In the minds of real sailor men they are monstrosities. Undoubtedly there are real difficulties in providing a definition which meets the case, but we simply cannot go on having the same yachting event of the world hang on the performances of clever toys.

Paris, Aug. 2—Strangely-shaped toques and small hats are the newest fashions for feminine headwear in Paris. One woman wore a toque without a top. It was formed of a circular band of black silk adorned with black and white cockfeathers, arranged alternately. Where the crown of the hat would have been normally was seen the hair of the wearer held in place with an elaborate tortoiseshell comb. Another new toque was entirely composed of pheasant's plumage.
