YACHT OR RACING MACHINE?

(New York Evening Post.)
If the Americas Cup means anything to you, it represents the yachting championship of the world and not the racing machine championship. The boat that won it was built in 1851 and fifty years later was still racing, and moreover was raced in weather that drove younger and faster boats to cover, while she rode the seas and finished strong and sound. The first challenger, schooners is it true, were sound. Wholesome boats, as were the defenders, and sailed for the cup—blow high or blow low—finishing strong and fast and ready to race the next day, the next year, the next decade. The same was true of the first of the big racing machines, which was the finest example of speed and strength. But nothing was said then of any danger to life. Saturday, however, in a 25-knot breeze which Puffin, Genesta, Mayflower, Galatea and the rest, of the early days, would have rejected in—and did—the race was called off and the reason given was danger to life.
Since when have American sailors been afraid of a twenty-five or even forty knot wind? That would a Gloucester fisherman have said under the circumstances? He would have shortened sail—not very much—and have welcomed the opportunity to show the calibre of his boat and his men. Hank Haff would

RELEASE ORDERED.

London, Aug. 1—Twelve industrial workers of the world convicted in Sydney, N.S.W., of sedition and conspiracy, are recommended for release, the judge stating that six should never have been convicted. An attempt was made to pledge all labor candidates at the recent state elections to advocate their release, but only the extremists pledged themselves.

FIRES CONTROLLED.

Amherst, N.S., Aug. 1—The forest fires which burned over two hundred acres of timber land at River Hebert and Macan, have been practically extinguished by a heavy fall of rain tonight.

Prohibition for Spain.

New York, Aug. 2—They are getting ready for prohibition in Spain. Three hundred and fifty wine growers from the land of the Dons have sold their vineyards in the belief that the whole world will soon be dry and have come to America to buy, if possible, something more "precious than the stuff they sold."

Paris, Aug. 2—Strangely-shaped toques and small hats are the newest fashions for feminine headwear in Paris. One woman wore a toque without a top. It was formed of a circular band of black silk adorned with black and white cockfeathers, arranged alternately. Where the crown of the hat would have been normally was seen the base of the wearer held in place with an elaborate tortoiseshell comb. Another new toque was entirely composed of pheasant's plumage.
