

FIVE MORE FOR FAILING TO FILE

Five additional citizens were before Magistrate Ritchie yesterday afternoon on charges of failing to file their income tax returns for the year 1918. A doctor's certificate was produced in court showing that Charles A. Clarke was too ill to attend, and Scott E. Morrell, who presented Leonard T. Dryden, said at his client was absent on account of the sickness of a friend. James P. money pleaded guilty to the charge of failing to file the statement. Frank Stevens and Henry McCullough added not guilty.

P. D. Tilley, for the prosecution, filed an affidavit showing that a registered letter was sent to Mr. Stevens on July 28, 1919, and also one to Mr. McCullough. Heley C. Wilson, who is an accountant in the office of A. W. Sharpe, pector of taxation, was placed on a stand and told of sending notices to Mr. Stevens on July 16, August and October 10, 1919. No returns had been received, said the witness. G. C. osman, a postal clerk in the St. John set office, produced receipts showing at a registered letter had been delivered to Mrs. Stevens on July 28, 1919, addressed to Frank D. Stevens. A letter to Henry McCullough had been signed for by Mrs. McCullough on the same date.

Mr. Stevens, who is a master mariner, was sworn and testified that he was away on naval service and had never received any notification until he received the summons to court. He did not intend to evade the law and since receiving the summons had filed the statement. He had never received any letters and Mrs. Stevens did not mention anything about the registered letter.

Mr. McCullough said that he had been notified by his firm that they had sent a statement in for him, to which Mr. McCullough himself to send in a statement.

All the cases were stood over until Friday afternoon, December 17, when they will be disposed of as well as others that had been heard previously.

FERGUSON IS AGAIN THE TORY LEADER

Toronto, Dec. 2.—Hon. G. Howard Ferguson was this afternoon re-elected leader of the Provincial Liberal-Conservative party in convention here. Two other candidates for the party leadership, Brigadier-General A. E. Ross, M. P. for Kingston, minister without portfolio in the Hearn government for a short time prior to the defeat of the government in 1919, and Hon. George S. Enery, minister of agriculture in the current government, and present M. P. for East York. Only one ballot was used to settle the question of leadership. Hon. Mr. Ferguson having a clear majority.

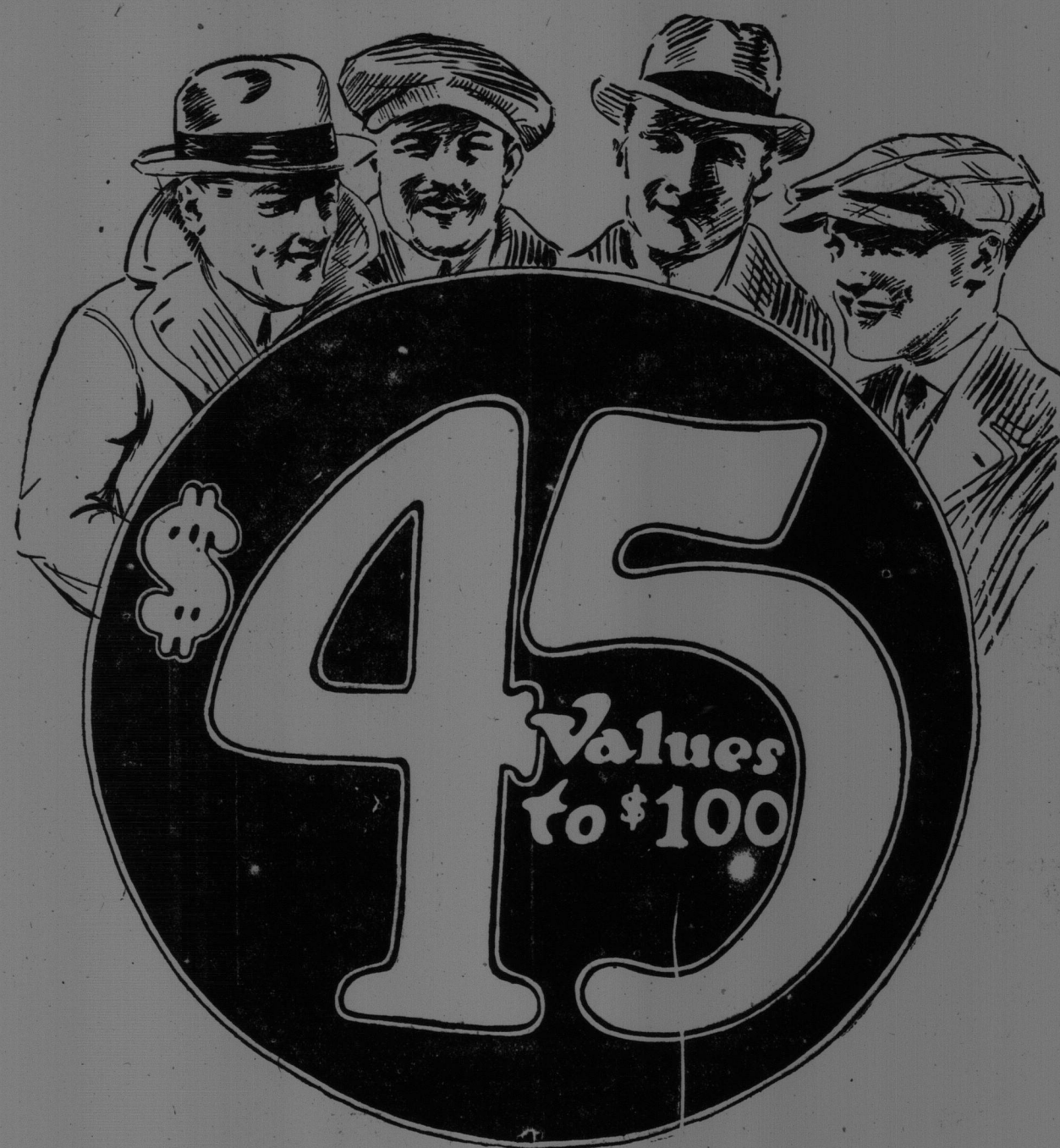

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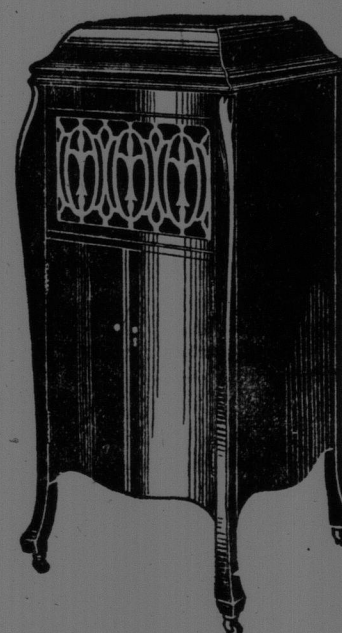
