DUKE OF CONNAUGHT REVIEWS FORCES AT HALIFAX

Veterans, Cadets and Ambulance Corps on Parade — Certificates Presented—A Striking Picture

Halifax, Aug. 15.—As field marshal of the British army Sir H. H. the Duke of Connaught on his grand tour of Canada reviewed the royal British Veterans, the veterans of the Fenian Raid, the cadets and of the Grand Prior of the Order of St. John of Jerusalem. He presented certificates to a large number of members of the St. John Ambulance Association, a body coming under the head of the first mentioned.

Despite threatening rain large crowds congregated outside the parade and along the streets, none but those directly interested being allowed within the enclosure. Not the least striking feature were the long lines of soldiers drawn up on either side of the street, the "Thin Red Line" of infantry together with artillery. The members of the royal party arrived at the parade sharp on time, the dukes not being present. The princess and her lady-in-waiting were the only ladies included. It was noticeable that the duke and the members of his staff wore military uniforms. As their autos rolled up onto the parade the royal standard was broken from the flag staff amid cheers.
