



Fainting usually last only a few minutes and the person recovers immediately when taken out into the fresh air, but there are cases in which it lasts much longer, sometimes for an hour or more. The first treatment of fainting is usually very sim-ple. Take the person out into the fresh air, lay him flat on his back with the head lower than the feet. This can be done by grasping the feet OWN

This can be done by grasping the feet and homong the body so that the head hangs down, or take an ordinary straight rangs down, or take an ordinary straight back chair, turn it over so that the back forms an angle with the floor, and place the person on the back of the chair with the head hanging down. This position with the head hanging down favors the flow of the blood to the brain.


