



"Radio Knife" Now

Chicago, April 17—A "radio knife" which may render virtually bloodless operations for cancerous growths was demonstrated here yesterday by Dr. L. E. Schmidt, who performed two operations with it. A low power radio transmitter is used to generate current. The 'knife'' resembling a knitting needle, forms one terminal; a shee' of tin foil on which the patient lies forms the other terminal. The human tissue, offering resistance to the current when the knife is applied, causes the generation of heat The knife burns itself through skin and muscle quickly and withou
