## DOUKHOBORS DEFY GOVERNMENT

### Sect Won't Study; Fears Acquiring City's Ways

Nelson, B. C .- The Doukhobors are on the warpath!

Yet the world always has known Yet the world always has known them only as a quiet, peace-loving people. But now they are aroused.

Their warlike efforts are directed at the Province of British Columbia—its educational authorities in particular.

No longer will they send their children to the public schools. For the schools, they say, teach their children to "make war—to kill"—and killing, even of animals, is abhorrent to the several thousand Doukhobors colonized here.

And the schools teach their boys and girls "city ways," to "leave the farms and go into the cities and stay out late at night."

The Doukhobors don't want their hildren to leave the farms because griculture is the very foundation of the Doukhobors' lives.

Mr. Spence showed that war was sometimes justifiable but contended that intemperance never was. God had commanded Joshua to war on the Canaanites but He scondemned intemperance. War sometimes tended to make civilization but intemperance never, he said.

# MEMORIAL FOR

First Edifice of Denomination in Canada Built in Village in 1788

Sackville, March 11—In view of the anticipated consummation of church union, it is considered desirable in Methodist circles that a monument should be erected to commemorate the beginning of Methodism in Canada, which beginning was at Point de Bute, where the work of Methodism began under the direction of Rev. William Black. The first Methodist church in Canada was erected at Point de Bute, in 1788, the land for the edifice being purchased the previous year. The building was of stone with thatched roof.




