word of God -- to those perishing for lack of this knowledge. Although the roads were now at their worst, we had fair meetings at Middle Musquodoboit and Elmsvale. The collections were \$1.68 and \$1.01. As yet I have not heard the result of the annual canvass.

I was at Upper Musquodoboit on Saturday night and Sunday morning, at Dean Settlement on Sunday afternoon and Monday night. The collections there were \$1.32 and \$2.33, and were afterwards supplemented by collectors' lists \$7.77—in all \$11.42. Mr. James CreeIman kindly met me at the latter place and conveyed me to his home at Newton Mills, where I had a meeting and received 93 cents. Since then we have received from this good Branch of Springside \$21.52. By some mistake the last year's contribution, remitted to Halifax on January 9th, 1896, did not appear in our printed Report.

At Upper Stewiacke Village I received \$1.59 and collector's list with \$28.16, and since then they sent to Halifax \$29.75.

We had a good meeting at Middle Stewiacke on the 9th. Collection \$2.30, and subscription lists of \$25.83—in all \$28.13. The following night at Brookfield the meeting was fair. Collection \$2.25, and your treasurer lately received \$10.75—in all \$13. This shows quite an advance from Brookfield, and that if our friends there are few they are liberal; indeed the whole Stewiacke Valley has been a staunch supporter of the Bible Society from the first year of its history, yielding annually over one hundred dollars.
