Venezuela Paying American Claims First Instalment of \$475,000 Handed to Minister Yesterday—Will Total More Than a Million.

CARACAS, Aug. 21.—W. W. Russell, American minister, came out of the foreign office today with a check in his pocket for \$52,375 to be paid to the New York and Venezuela Government, and also the signed protocol by which the Venezuela government has agreed to pay \$415,000 more in seven yearly instalments. The \$475,000 is the first of several large sums which the present government of Venezuela must pay in settlement for the confiscation and destruction of American property rights in Venezuela by the late Castro government. The whole amount will be more than a million dollars as a large monetary indemnity will probably be paid also to the Orinoco Corporation.
