CHARES PITCHED GREAT GAME; F.M.A. TEAM BANGOR FAILS TO FREDERICTON WON GAME OF 6 INNINGS

There was a large crowd of fans at the North End grounds Saturday afternoon to witness what proved an excellent game of ball between the Marathons and the St. Croix team, which the Greeks won by a score of 6 to 4.

McPhee was the hurler for the visiting team and pitched a good steady game with a couple of exceptions, when in the eighth inning he presented the Marathons with a score hit making two wild pitches. The best that the Marathons could do with the Kasper was to make seven safe ones off him, one of these being a two bagger hit by O'Brien, and which proved the only one in the game.

Charles was the pitcher for the home team, and he pitched a great game. He only allowed four singles.

Two were made in the first inning and two were made in the sixth.

The Marathons made two of the hits and Tetreault and Jacobson made the others.

He struck six visitors out and certainly showed what class he is in when he wound up in good shape in the last inning and struck out the three men to face him. In five innings not a St. Croix man reached first base. One man reached first in the third inning and another got that far in the eighth on bases on balls and then the side was retired.

St. Croix made two runs in the first inning and two in the sixth, and this is how it happened:

In the first inning Charles pitched to right field and was then thrown out trying to steal second. Lynch hit to Waterhouse at short who missed. Tetreault singled to centre, and a wild pitch advanced these runners a bag. Jacobson hit to Pinkerton who let the ball get away from him which allowed Lynch and Tetreault to score. Jacobson hit to right safe Lynch scored. The next two to bat went out to the infield. The four runs were gradually banded to the St. Croix team on errors.

The sides were retired quickly in the next two innings, and by the fifth when the Greeks earned one run and third baseman Lynch presented them with two. Ramsey singled to left. Charles beat out a hit to pitcher, for whom McPhee fielded the bunt. There was no one covering the first base, as Vance had also run in for the bunt. O'Brien came across with a two bagger to right field and Ramsey scored. Pinkerton struck out and Shankey went out, pitcher to first.

Peace hit one to left, who had plenty of time to throw to first, but he threw low and the result was that on the error Charles and O'Brien scored. Blue struck out and retired the side.

The Greeks made their sixth run in the eighth inning. Shankey hit to short, who muffed. Peace hit to short and Shankey was forced out at second. Blue hit out to first. A wild pitch put Peace on third, and another wild pitch allowed him to score. Waterhouse singled to left and stole second. Riley drew a base on balls and Waterhouse got out trying to steal third.
