

ADMISSION.

THE ACADEMIC YEAR consists of one Term, commencing on the FIRST TUESDAY IN SEPTEMBER and ending on the FRIDAY preceding the FIRST MONDAY IN JULY.

Students will be admitted on the following conditions:

Those who have already passed the entrance examination to any of the High Schools or County Academies, those holding High School Certificates of any Grade, those holding Teachers' Licenses, those holding Provincial Normal School Diplomas, will be admitted without further examination. All others will be required to pass an examination on the following,—

(1). ENGLISH.—Punctuation, Sentence Building, Correcting Wrong Forms; Elements of Prosody, Figures of Speech, &c. Prescribed text book in Grammar omitting notes and small print.

(2). GEOGRAPHY.—Elementary Geography in full with special attention given to map drill.

(b). HISTORY.—History of British America. British History as in "Brief History of England."

(3). ARITHMETIC.—As in Kennedy and O'Hearn. Algebra, fundamental rules. Special attention should be given to evaluation of Algebraic expressions.

(4). USEFUL KNOWLEDGE.—A paper containing questions on useful knowledge as embraced in the Common School Course. The Health Readers No. I. and II., and Chemistry and Physics Primers give an idea of work required. Analysis of a few common plants as in Gray's Botany. There will be an imperative question on Tonic-sol-fa notation.

(6). DRAWING, WRITING, and SIMPLE ACCOUNTS.—Construction of Angles and Simple Geometrical figures to scale and
