MACDONALD, PETER, M.D. (*East Huron.*)

Parents from Inverness, Scotland, settled in Pictou, N.S. in 1830, and removed to Co. of Huron in 1846. B. in Pictou, N.S., 14 Aug. 1835, and ed. in Toronto. M. 21 Feb. 1865, Margaret Ross. Is a practising physician. Has been Mayor, Reeve and Councillor of the town of Wingham, and Chairman of the Board of School Trustees for a number of years. First returned to Parlt. at g.e. 1887 and re-elected at g.e. 1891. A Liberal. Favours Senate and Civil Service reform, and the delegation to Canada by the Imperial Government of the power of making her own treaties with foreign powers.—*Wingham, Ont.*

MACDOWALL, DAY HORT. (*Saskatchewan.*)

Second s. of Henry Macdowall, of Garthland, Scot., B. in 1850 at Carruth House, Renfrewshire, Scot. M. 12 Aug. 1884, Miss Blanchard. Ed. at Windlesham, Surrey, Eng. and Trinity Coll., Glenalmond, Scot. Is a lumber manufacturer. Was a captain in the Renfrewshire Rifle Vol. from 1872 to 1879. Accompanied Gen. Middleton's force through the late North-West Rebellion, and took charge of the party despatched by the General through the rebel districts from Humboldt to Prince Albert. Sat in N. W. Council for the Dist. of Lorne, from June 5, 1883, to Sept. 1885. First returned to Parlt. at g.e. 1887 and re-elected at last g.e. A Conservative.—*Prince Albert, N. W. T.; Manitoba Club, Winnipeg; Wanderers' Club, Pall Mall, London, England; Rideau Club, Ottawa.*

MACKENZIE, Hon. ALEXANDER, P.C. (*East York.*)

Third s. of the late Alexander Mackenzie, of Logierait, Perthshire, Scot., by Mary, second dau. of Mr. Donald Fleming, of the same parish; and grands. of Mr. Malcolm Mackenzie, of Strathmummel. The family, consisting of the parents and seven sons came to Can. in 1842. One of the sons—the late Hope F. Mackenzie, Esq.—represented Lambton and afterwards North Oxford, in the Can.
