SCOTT, Lieut. Col. THOMAS. (*Selkirk.*)

Parents emigrated to Can. from Armagh, Irel., in 1836. B. in the County of Lanark, Ont., 1841. Ed. at Perth High School. M. in 1863, at Perth, second dau. of Robt. Kellock, Esq. Commenced the publication of the *Perth Expositor* newspaper, in the Conservative interest, in the year 1861, and conducted it until 1873, when he removed to Manitoba. Was Capt. of a volunteer corps at Perth, and was on frontier duty at Brockville and Prescott for three months in 1866; gazetted Major of the 42nd Batt., same year, and Bt. Lieut. Col. in 1871; received command of a company in the Ontario Rifles in 1870, forming part of the Red River Expeditionary Force, under Col. Wolseley; returned to Ontario, winter of 1870-71, and, when the Fenians invaded Manitoba in the fall of 1871, again offered his services to the Govt., and was appointed to the command of the second expedition, which, after undergoing severe hardships, arrived safely at Fort Garry on 18 Nov. 1871. Elected Mayor of the City of Winnipeg in 1877 by a majority of votes, and in 1878 by acclamation. First returned to the Leg. Assembly, Manitoba, at g.e. 1878; re-elected at g.e. 1879. Resigned to contest Selkirk for the Commons, Sept. 1880, and was elected over the late member, Hon. D. A. Smith, by a majority of 158. Conservative.—*Winnipeg, Man.*

SCRIVER, JULIUS. (*Huntingdon.*)

Descended from U. E. Loyalists, who came to Can. from Dutchess County, N.Y., at the close of the revolution. B. at Hemmingford, P.Q., 26 Feb. 1826. Ed. at the University of Vermont. M. Miss Frances A. Stevens, of Potsdam, N.Y. Is Presdt. of the Quebec Frontier Railway. Sat for Huntingdon in Que. Assembly from the Union until Sept. 1869, when he resigned and was returned to Commons by acclamation. Re-elected by acclamation at g.e. 1872; and again returned at g.e. 1874. Re-elected by acclamation at last g.e. A Liberal.—*Hemmingford, P.Q.*
