

Commissioner of Inland Revenue.—Lieut. Col.

ALFRED BRUNEL, *C.E.* B. 1818. Is a Civil Engineer by profession, and from 1844 to 1850 was employed on various public works in Can. Was Asst. Engineer of the Northern Railway, 1852; Superintendent of same Road, from 1853 to 1856; an Alderman of Toronto from 1857 to 1862; City Engineer of Toronto, 1859-60. Took an active part in the organization of the 10th ("Royals") Regt. V. M., during the "Trent" difficulty, 1861; of which he was gazetted Major, March, 1862, and Lieut. Col., July, 1865, and continued in active command of the Regt., which was on duty during the whole Fenian troubles) until he resigned, retaining his rank, 1871. Was a Commissioner to inquire into the state of the Customs' Ports, and especially as to the working of the Free Ports of Gaspé and Sault Ste. Marie, 1862. Appd. Inspector of Customs, Excise and Canals, 1863; Asst. Commissioner of Inland Revenue, 1869; and to his present office, 1871. Is *ex officio* a mem. of the Civil Service Board, and of the Board of Audit. Salary \$2,600.) *Metcalf St.; Eastern Block.*
