

POULIOT, BARTHÉLÉMY, J.P. [*L'Islet.*]

S. of M. Berthélémy Pouliot, merchant, by Louise Blais. B. in St. Jean d'Orléans, Q., 15 Oct., 1811. Ed. in Quebec. M. Miss M. Fraser. Is a merchant, and a Commissioner for the trial of Small Causes. First returned to Parlt. at last g. e. for present seat, but unseated on petition in 1869, when new election, and he was again returned. A Conservative, and a supporter of Sir G. E. Cartier.—*L'Islet, Que.*

POWER, PATRICK, J.P. [*Halifax.*]

B. in Co. Waterford, Irel., 17 March, 1815. Came to Halifax, 1823. Ed. there. Head of the firm of P. Power & Co., dry goods merchants. Is a Commissioner of Schools, Halifax, and of the Poor's Asylum and City Hospital. First returned to Parlt. at last g. e. A Conservative; has been opposed to Confederation with Canada.—*South Park St., Halifax, N.S.*

POZER, CHRISTIAN HENRY. [*Beauce.*]

Of German descent. S. of the late William Pozer, Esq., of St. George d'Aubert Gallion, Q. B. there, 26 Dec., 1835. Ed. in Quebec. Unmarried. Called to the Bar, L.C., July, 1860. A dir. of the Levis and Kennebec Railway and of the Quebec and Gosford Railway. Was an unsuccessful candidate for present seat in Can.
