An Act to amend the Ordinance which provides for the Registration of Titles to, and Incumbrances on Real Property.

WHEREAS great inconvenience has resulted from carrying into effect a certain provision of the Ordinance of the Governor and Special Council for the late Province of Lower Canada, passed in the Fourth year of the Reign of Her Majesty Queen Victoria, and intituled, "*An Ordinance to prescribe and regulate the registering of titles to lands, tenements and hereditaments, real or immoveable estates, and of charges and incumbrances on the same, and for the alteration and improvement of the law, in certain particulars, in relation to the alienation and hypothecation of real estates, and the rights and interest acquired therein,*" and it is expedient and necessary to amend the said ordinance by repealing a certain part thereof: Be it therefore enacted, &c.,

15 That the thirty-sixth section of the Ordinance aforesaid, concerning married women of full age, be wholly repealed and abrogated, and remain null as if it had never been enacted, save and except with regard to debts and obligations contracted by such married women of full age, from which they have been discharged by their renunciation of the community of goods between them and their husbands, and which shall not be held to revive by reason of this Act.
