

Dear Dr.King: -

Thank you for your kindly note. I hope your Sedretary will be able to set some of the French agoing to take up the matter for their people and relieve me of that branch of the work. I wish our friends in Montreal would form a branch of the Association for the Province of Quebec in order especially to organize the French element of our population.

I am sending you herewith a quotation from a letter from a gentleman living in Ottawa who takes an

interest in our work. "I must say to you frankly that
my sympathies do not go very strongly with the celebration
of a peace that is past on the part of a Government that
is promoting the growth of the military spirit in
Candda by encouraging military drill in the public
schools, and by increasing enormously the military and
naval establishments of the country in the interest of
a flamboyant imperialism. I would be much more
interested in promoting some sentiment in the country
against these evil tendencies and in favor of a future
peace. There is a great deal of practical work to be
done by a Canadian Peace and Arbitration Society, if it
will only get its fighting spirit roused in the interest
of peace."
