I have to acknowledge the receipt of your letter of the 9th inst. with reference to the blackboards at the Morley day school.

It is presumed that these boards are made of wood, and, if it is not practicable to make them serviceable by coating them with liquid slating, you may purchase sufficient slated cloth to cover the two boards, but the Department does not think it advisable to make a new board of this description. When the question of school site on this reserve has been definitely decided, steps will be taken to provide suitable blackboard accommodation.
