News experience with London Advertiser and Canadian Press; wrote very acceptable radio bulletins but is now an editor with C.P.

CARLISLE ALLISON:

About thirty-five years of age; news editor of Winnipeg Tribune; probably not earning more than \$4,000. He is a son of Dr. W. T. Allison, Professor of English, University of Manitoba. Born in Winnipeg.

Reporter and Editor Winnipeg Free Press. English, Oxford graduate, interested in creative writing; imaginative and adaptable.

Thirty-two years of age; at present editor for war, Financial Post, Toronto; probably earning about \$3,500. to \$4,000 a year. Although his present position is largely a writing job, he had valuable copy desk experience at the Toronto Star where he also broadcast the news for three years, so that he has a knowledge of radio requirements. He has a PhD in history from the University of Toronto.

PETER McRITCHIE:

About 38 years of age; at present chief sub-editor of the Globe and Mail; formerly news editor for the Windsor Star. A good, practical newspaper man who probably earns about \$4,000
