HOMESTEAD REGULATIONS.

Any even numbered section of Dominion and is in Manitoba or the North-west Territories, excepting 8 and 50, which has not been homesteaded, or reserved to provide wood tols for settlers, or for other purposes, may be homesteaded upon by any person who is the scale head of a family, or any male over 18 years of ag, to the extent of one-quarter section of 108 acres, more or less, or the section of 108 acres, more or less.

Entry may be made personally at the local land office for the District in which the land to be taken its situate, or if the homested desires he may, on application to the Minister of the Interior, Ottawa, the Commissioner of Immigration, Whintipeg, or the Local Agent for the district in which the land is situate, receive authority and the control of the control of the A fee of \$10 is charged for a homestead entry

HOMESTEAD, DUTIES.

A settler who has been granted an entry for a homestead is required by the provisions of the Dominion Lands Act and the amendments thereto to perform the conditions connected therewith, under one of the following plans:—

At least six months' residence upon and cultivation of the land in each year during the term of three years.

(2) If the father (or mother, if the father is deceased) or any person who is eligible to make a homestead entiry upon the provisions of this Act, resides upon a farm in the vicinity of the land entered for by such person as a homestead, the requirements of this Act as to residence price to obtaining patent may be satisfied by such person residing with the father or mother.

(3) If a settler has obtained a patent for his homestead, or a certificate for the issue of such patent countersigned in the manner pre-scribed by this Act, and has obtained entry for a second homestead, the requirements of this Act as to residence may be satisfied by residence upon the first homestead, if the second homestead is in the vicinity of the first homestead.

(4) If the settler has his permanent residence upon farming land owned by him in the vicinity of his household, the requirements of this Act as to residence may be satisfied by residence upon the said land.

The term "vicinity" used above is meant o indicate the same township or an adjoining r cornering township.

A settler who avails himself of the provisions of Clauses (2)(3) or (4) must cultivate 30 acres of his homestead, or substitute 20 head of stock with buildings for their accommodation, and have besides 80 acres substantially fenced.

Every homesteader who fails to comply with the requirements of the homesteader law is inble to have his entry cancelled, and the land may be again thrown open for entry.

APPLICATION FOR PATENT

Should be made at the end of the three years before the Local Agent, Sub-Agent or the Homestead Inspector. Before making application for patent the settler must give six mouths notice in writing to the Commissioner of Dominion Lands at Ottawa of his intention to do so.

INFORMATION

Newly arrived immigrants will receive at the Immigration Office in Wirnipeg, or at any Dominion Lands Office in Manticha or the Jonation Lands Office in Manticha or the lands that are open for entry, and from the lands that are open for entry, and from the officers in charge, free of expense, advice and assistance in securing lands to suit them. Full and an internal laws, as well as respecting Dominion Lands in the Railway Belt in Piritish Columbia, may be obtained upon aportion of the Interior, Ottawa; the Commissioner of the Interior, Ottawa; the Commissioner of the Interior, Winnipeg, Manticha; or to any of the Donninon Lands agents in Manitoba or the North-west Territories.
