How if no Military post within the District in which Decerter shall be apprehended.

Farsons having apprehended deserters may command affistance for their safekeeping &c.

Allowance to persons so employed.

Majefty's Regular Forces in this Province, who shall apprehend any Deerster or Deferters from fuch Regular Forces, and deliver up fuch Deferter or Deferters to any Officer commanding any military post in this Province, shall for each and every fuch Deferter or Deferters, fo apprehended and delivered up, be entitled to, and shall receive in the manner hereinaster directed, a reward of Five Pounds, current money of this Province, upon producing a certificate of fuch apprehention and delivery, fpecifying the name or names of fuch Deferter or Deferters, and to what regiment or corps he or they belong, as may appear by confession or otherwise, figned by the officer to commanding, and by any Juffice of the Peace for the diffrict before whom fuch Deferter or Deferters fall be brought, which certificate such Officer and Justice of the Peace are hereby authorized and required to grant ; Provided neverthelefs, That when any Deferter or Deferters shall be fo apprehended in any district of this Province, in which there may be no military post at the time, it shall and may be lawful for any Justice of the Peace before whom any Deferter or Deferiers may be brought, and he is hereby required to commit by warrant under his hand and feak every fuch Deferter or Deferters, to the common Gaol of the District wherein he or they may be apprehended, to be therein kept in fafe cuftody, until demanded by and delivered up to any officer or detachment of his Majefty's Forces demanding fuch Deferter or Deferters, then, and in that cafe, the certificate of fuch Juffice of the Peace, counterfigned by the Keeper of fuch Goal, acknowledging the receipt of fuch Deferter or Deferters, into his cultody, fhall be deemed fufficient.

II. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, That when any perfon or perfons who may have apprehended any Deferter or Deferters, may require further affiftance for the fafe keeping and conveying fuch Deferter or Deferters to the neareft military post or common goal, fuch perfon or perfons shall have authority to call upon as many of the inhabitants (not being Quakers, Menonists or Tunkers) as may be required for that purpose, and no more. And each and every perfon so employed, shall be entitled to receive and demand fix-pence per mile for every mile he shall go and return upon such fervice, to be ascertained is required, by the oath of such sperson, and the faid sum of fix-pence per mile, shall be paid under the like certificate, as the aforesaid reward of five pounds is herein directed to be paid.
