Terrible War in the Balkans Exacts a Very Heavy Toll.

[Canadian Press Despatch]

LONDON, July 9.—Reports of the General Kovatcheff's army are confiremed in a Sofia despatch to The Times, which estimates the losses on both sides as scarcely less than 000 killed and wounded. The Bulgarians made the most desperale ighting and performed great feats of heroism before they were routed, suffering the severer losses.

Nothing is apparently known concerning General Petroff's army or the position of General Boyadjieff, who was sent to reinforce General Kovatcheff.
