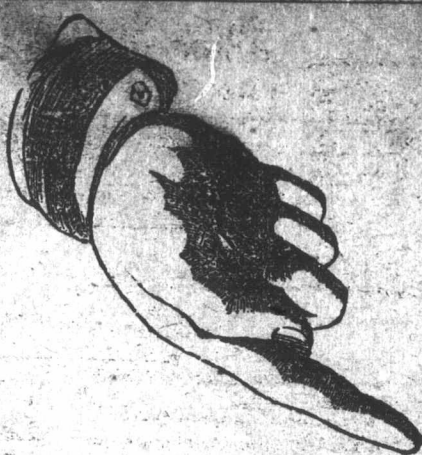

### FRUIT MEN ELECT OFFICERS.

Annual Meeting of Niagara District As-  
sociation at St. Catharines.

St. Catharines, Dec. 20.—The an-  
nual meeting of the United Fruit  
Growers' Association of the Niagara  
Peninsula opened here yesterday. The  
election of officers resulted as fol-  
lows: President, William Hen-  
dershott, Thorold; 1st vice-president,  
D. J. McKinnon; 2nd vice-president,  
Mr. Honsberger; 3rd vice-president,  
F. G. Stewart; 4th vice-president,  
James Dunlop; secretary-treasurer,  
Carl E. Fischer; Executive Commit-  
tee, Albert Pay, William W. Arm-  
strong, James Carnahan, R. Thomp-  
son, A. Haynes, W. H. Bunting, S.  
H. Rittenhouse, Thomas Berriman,  
C. W. Vanderburg, A. Raiton, C.  
W. Vanduzer, F. A. Goring, M. Pet-  
tit, W. H. Gainer, W. A. Hutt, Geo.  
X. Walker, W. C. McCalla, William  
Freel, G. A. Robertson, S. M. Culp.  
The San Jose scale question came  
up for discussion, and was spoken  
to by Messrs. D. J. McKinnon, W.  
A. Thompson, W. H. Bunting, E.  
Morden and others.

A committee of Messrs. W. C. Mc-  
Calla, W. H. Bunting, William Freel,  
F. G. Stewart and James Titterton  
were appointed to report on the  
question at the next meeting.

At the afternoon session several  
subjects were brought up for dis-  
cussion, and, among others, the  
grading of fruit. It was the opin-  
ion of many that apples should be  
graded, packed in boxes and marked  
by the growers themselves. In re-  
ference to dishonest packing, in-  
stances were given where the whole  
sale and commission men had been  
responsible for much of the dishonest  
grading, and had even gone so  
far as to mix high and low grade  
fruits.

W. H. Bunting, the Fruit Commis-  
sioner to the Pan-American, gave an  
address on the results of the Domini-  
on exhibit there. He found much  
ignorance, even among the best  
classes who visited the Fair, on  
Canada and her products, and con-  
sidered the splendid horticultural ex-  
hibits had been a great advertise-  
ment. Only three exhibits in the  
Horticultural Building had been  
awarded medals. Two went to Cal-  
ifornia and one to Ontario.

A vote of thanks was tendered Mr.  
Bunting by the association for the  
magnificent results of the Canadian  
exhibits in horticulture at the Ex-  
position.
