New Pulp and Paper Mills

Newfoundland Products.
 (London Times)

The Newfoundland Legislature at its last Session enacted measures enabling two pulp and paper companies, one British and one Norwegian, to establish industries of this character within the island.

The British company is to operate at Bonne Bay, midway up the West Coast. The district is thickly wooded and rivers afford sufficient water power. The Norwegian company is establishing itself in Bonavista Bay.

The world-wide demand for paper has stimulated the utilization of all suitable areas for this purpose and these two undertakings are expected to lead the way to others within the next year or so. Indeed, it is understood that negotiations are at present in progress with a view to utilizing areas on the South Coast, and a substantial enterprise will probably come into existence within the timber holdings of the Reid Company, obtained by them as part of the concession for the working of the island's railroad system, may also be made the basis of a large pulp and paper concern.

It is possible that at the session of the Legislature next spring an enactment will be sought enabling the establishment of a paper and pulp mill, a saw mill, and a veneer mill at St. George's on the West Coast. The latter is a new development, but is said to be a promising one for this country.

It will be utilized for manufacturing the abundant growth of birch wood in the district for the making of boxes and barrels, the wood being cut off the lands at the same time as the spruce and fir to be used for the making of pulp and paper. The company promoting this enterprise is composed of British and American capitalists who control about 1,500 square miles of timber in the St. George's area and about 1,000 square miles at Grand Lake, where they may also erect a pulp and saw mill and ship the products to the docks at St. George's by rail. The mills are to be erected between the main line of the island railway and the waterside in St. George's Harbour, where a large pier will be built, enabling ocean-going ships to load in safety.

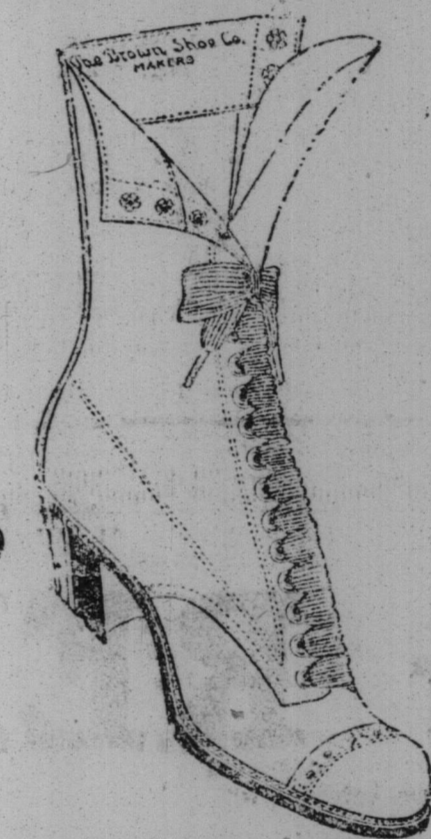
