OLD ESTATES GO.

Great Land Holdings in England
Seemed to Be Doomed Now.

Many of the big estates of English landholders, which have given to the countryside of Great Britain that charm of old-world atmosphere which has made it so attractive to American tourists are doomed, according to London newspapers, if the present tendency in the real estate market in the British Isles continues.

Heavy taxation, according to these newspapers, has compelled many old families to dispose of their vast acres, and, while the estates are being eagerly bought, in few cases is an effort made by the new owners to retain them in their entirety. As a result, England bids fair to become in the not distant future a nation of small landlords.

Many families of the large gentry-owning class, while retaining part of their property, have found it necessary to cut up other parts into small portions to sell. Others have sold outright to members of the class of recent rich created by the war, who themselves have disposed of parts of the acquired estates to smaller owners.

The old-style English squire, it is predicted, soon will be a rarity, or will entirely have disappeared. The type of country gentleman who took a personal interest in his tenants will be no more. Village life will be completely changed because of the new class of tenants.

Incidentally, it is reported, that the cherished institution of fox hunting is being spoiled. Since many small farmers own their lands outright, and since these lands represent to them their living, they are refusing to let the hounds and riders pass over their fields. And as the land is coming more and more cut up into small parcels, the hunters are finding themselves more and more restricted.

Happy Married Celebrities.

"The reason why my long married life has been so happy," said the late Lady Tennyson, "is that my husband has always been my lover. We are far more lovers to-day than when we married so very many years ago." And this has been the happy experience of other wedded couples whose courtship days have lasted long as life itself.

"Charles Kingsley called himself 'an old married man' when he wrote to his wife from a solitary convalescent holiday at the seaside. 'This place is perfect, but it seems a dream, and imperfect without you. Queen in Her Own Right.

VARIETY IN LIFE AT OMSK

Siberian City, However, Holds Out Little Inducement to the Timid, Pleasure-Seeking Traveler.

Omsk is a little city, or a big town—whichever you like—in Siberia. The buildings of Omsk keep close to the ground. The home of the settler is a one-story log affair. The public buildings and shops are ornate with pillars and carvings, but their grandeur extends upward little farther than the log hut, of which they are an elaboration.

Omsk has more than its share of lawbreaking and crime. The number of persons who die inopportunistly there is large enough to inspire more caution than bravado in one enjoying a nighttime walk through the lanes which pass for streets.

There is a jail in this rustic metropolis, but its inmates are, as a rule, only the most recent malefactors, who have been so careless as to be apprehended by the wooden-shoed policemen who rattle about the streets at night to assure the city that the law is not sleeping. The majority of those who have resorted to violence or stealth to gain their ends are always at large.

Knowledge of this is not reassuring, but it adds to the stimulating atmosphere of the Siberian life to wonder whether the queer-looking shop clerk or waiter who serves you is a pillar of the church or the man who mysteriously made away with a fur draped the week before—"Niksh," in Chicago Daily News.
