We regret being unable to report any improvement in the fishery in Conception Bay since last advised.

A Telegram was received here from Dublin on Saturday last which will be heard of with exceeding regret throughout the community. It announced the death of Miss Jane Scott, sister of Lady Glover, caused by falling from a balcony in Kingstown. No further particulars were given. The melancholy accident has awakened in town a feeling of deep sympathy with Lady Glover and the lamented deceased's other sister, Miss Scott, at present on a visit here.—Nfldr.

A little misunderstanding we believe took place yesterday morning between the fair ones of Fox Trap and the Railway Surveyors. The cause of the trouble, we believe, was the necessity of the part of the Surveyors to enter upon certain fields, &c., for the purpose of marking or staking the ground and thereby completing their survey. The ladies however had put their faces against the railway ab initio, and no amount of persuasion on the part of their husbands, (who by the bye are in favour of it,) and the Surveyors, could prevail upon them to allow the latter to perform their duties in peace. His worship Judge Prowse took his departure for the scene in the afternoon, and spent, no doubt, a pleasant hour or two with the advocates of "woman's rights."—Chronicle.

Between nine and ten o'clock last evening, while the Hon. James J. Rogerson was driving to his country residence, the horse collided with another driven by a man named Roche. The shaft of Mr. Rogerson's carriage entered the breast of Roche's horse, inflicting a wound from the effects of which the animal died, in a few moments. The collision took place near the Gas House, River Head.

TELEGRAPHIC.

HALIFAX, July 26. The relief committees in Ireland have nearly completed their work. All the crops are good. An eruption of Vesuvius and an earth quake at Naples occurred yesterday. An anti-British rising of the tribes under Ayob Khan is reported to have taken place near Candahar. The Powers are preparing for a naval demonstration to compel Turkey to concede the Greek boundary. It is said that Russia and China have re-opened negotiations. Mr. Gladstone's budget had a narrow escape from a combination of Conservatives and brewers.

July 27. Lord Roseberry has been nominated Rector of Edinburgh University by the Liberals and Mr. Christian by the Conservatives. The Mormon missionaries have been expelled by the German Government. Mr. Southern is very ill. Affairs in Afghanistan are looking hopeless. Abdul Rahman Khan is gaining strength every hour. The Communist demonstration in Paris proved a failure. Cattle disease is prevalent in Picton, Nova Scotia. It is attributed to exposure and semi-tarvation during the winter.

July 28. Irish relief bill passed 2nd reading House of Lords. Compensation bill goes to House of Lords in charge of Earl Granville. The Times urges rejection bill. Earl Grey leader opposition. Eugenie returned from Africa. Heavy rain damaged English crops. Reported that the Queen addressed autographic letter to Sultan imploring him accede to the wishes of powers. Hartington gave a hopeful account of Afghan affairs, highly commending Abdul Rahman.
