Wholesale looting of merchandise transit on the railroads of the nited States caused a loss of aproximately \$45,000,000 in 1919; acrding to United States Railroad dministration statistics made public

This is estimated to be more than buble the losses sustained in any re-war year, but it is pointed out at the increased cost of the comodities stolen, roughly estimated to verage 85 per cent. must be taken ito consideration when comparing he losses in the days of low price tith losses now. Nevertheless there as been a steadily increasing numer of packages stolen, and the oranization combatting the thieves ave met an increased ingenuity in iverting goods from their owners. 
