The regular meeting of the Edmonton Public School Board was held Thursday evening at the residence of Chairman Taylor, Fourth street.

The superintendent presented his report for the month, which indicates that the school population is steadily increasing.

The number in the high school was 74, divided as follows: Standard VII, 42; Standard VIII, 23; Standard VIII, 9.

The superintendent recommended that a new school centre be established on Ross' flats, to take care of pupils below Standard III.

Archdeacon Grey, chairman of the school management committee, presented a report recommending the addition of typewriting and stenography to the present commercial course in the high school.

Oppose the New Freight Rates. Winnipeg Board of Trade Protests to Commission Against New Tariffs of C.P.R. and C.N.R.

Winnipeg, Nov. 15.—The council of the board of trade held a meeting last evening and investigated the changes in freight rates which were recently announced. It is not satisfied with the tariffs. The council found that the rates out of Winnipeg to Manitoban points under the new proposed tariffs are increased, while to most points in Saskatchewan and Alberta a slight reduction appears, also that the rates on commodities to Kootenay points will be very heavily increased.

The meeting decided to send the following telegram to the board of railway commissioners embodying resolutions adopted at the earlier meeting: "Winnipeg, Nov. 14: Hon. A. C. Kilham, chairman board of railway commissioners, Ottawa. Joint meeting of jobbers and shippers' association and council of board of trade protest emphatically against the proposed tariff of freight rates out of Winnipeg, C.P.R.C.W. 746 and C.N.C.R.C. 199, and contend that any readjustment of freight rates out of Winnipeg should be done on the basis of rates out of St. Paul and Minneapolis, to Minnesota and Dakota points, and should be no higher than the rates.
