"Every person liable to taxation under this Act shall, on or before the first day of February in each year, without any notice or demand, deliver in duplicate to the Minister (of Finance and Customs) a return in form B of the Schedule to this Act or in such other form as the Minister ma prescribe covering each accounting period for which he is liable to taxa

Outport business men who have hitherto thought that they were free and independent, and conducting their usiness according to their own methods, will now realize that they can no longer do so. Those who have hitherto not been able, through cir cumstances over which they have n control, to settle up their previous year's business before April will now have to do so in February. For in stance an outport business man usua ly has to visit St. John's in January to make arrangements for salt and supplies the coming season. This trip generally takes from one to three weeks. Then he returns home and takes stock. After stock taking i over he gets his traps, etc., mended fo the next summer. Not until this done does he make up his balance sheet and open his books for the current year. Now all this has got to be altered. The outport merchant will self accordingly.
