FROST IN MANITOBA It Comes Too Late to Do Harm to Grain -Threshing Is Now General.

Light frost is reported from Newdale, Birtle, Binscarth, Langenburg, Saltcoate, Yorkton, and heavier at Rapid City, where potato vines were destroyed a good deal. The impression is that in other places very little damage was done, except at Newdale. The crops are out to a considerable extent, and as this is all a stock raising country, it is not fortunately dependent on the highest grade of wheat. If any grain is very much damaged it will be fed to the stock, but a great deal of the grain which is still uncut is beyond any great damage by frost. Frost is also reported at Edmonton, N. W. T. but serious damage is not anticipated.
