TO PAY FOR TESTIMONYPremier Drury Claims A. C.  
Harris, Train Despatcher,  
Was Not Bribed.

## FEARED PERSECUTION

Witness, Afraid of Hydro Com-  
mission, Was Told To Tell  
the Truth.

Toronto, Feb. 9.—Premier Drury denied absolutely yesterday that he had ever hinted or intimated in any way that A. C. Harris, a train despatcher, would be given a job in return for evidence before the Gregory commission.

Mr. Harris was reported yesterday to have given evidence before the Gregory commission investigating hydro matters at Niagara Falls to the effect that it had been hinted to him by F. H. Greenlaw, M. L. A. for St. Catharines, that there would be a job for him if he gave evidence against the hydro and that he later had an interview with Premier Drury.

The premier had made no direct promise, he said, to have stated, but he was led to believe that something would come out of it.

Mr. Harris asked me for a job, and a job was never mentioned," said the premier this morning. Harris has expressed fear of persecution by the hydro commission and the premier before the inquiry and the premier told him to go ahead and tell the truth.

Mr. Greenlaw said today that Mr. Harris had discussed with him the possibility of his getting a job on the T. & N. O. Railway. "I told him I would not do anything to secure such a job for him," said Mr. Greenlaw. "I told him he need not be afraid, to go ahead and tell the truth. This, however, had nothing to do with our discussion about a job on the T. & N. O. There was no connection between the two matters whatever."
