LUCK OF JOHNNY SKAG.

Death of a Man Who Made \$10,000,000 in Mining Speculation.

SAN FRANCISCO, July 18.—John Skag, once prominent in the list of California speculators, died on Friday. Skag ranked among the great speculators of the world. He was born in 1850 with Flood, Mackay, Sherman, Ketchum, Fish, Floyd and Bedford. Nearly all of his immense wealth was made away from the stock exchange, and he was a poor Hebrew boy, born in Canada. Thrown on the world for financial reasons, he came to California.

He managed to pick up a knowledge of telegraphing, and in 1859 was employed as a telegraph operator in San Francisco. Afterward he was a clerk in the San Francisco waterworks office. He was induced by friends in 1875 to try his luck in the Sierra Nevada mine. In May the stock was offered and sold at \$2.75. In about thirty days the shares went up to \$100, and in September they brought \$75 in the San Francisco mining exchange.
